



### Bull's head


From page 1 to page 83 - 42 watermarks divided into 4 groups
For the identification, felt-side and mould-side are not being considered






### **Differences**

- The thickness of the horn(s)
- The lenght and position of the nostrils

The finding of n. 76843 and many more similar (but not identical) watermarks in the Archivio di Stato have raised several questions:


- How many bull's head watermarks are there in Turin? (136)

- Provenance and period?



One direct match - watermark n. **41427**, Brünn - 1458




# 2 Briquet - *bull's head* reference

"Dans les n° 15.037 à 15.117, la tête de bœuf est surmontée d'un trait étoilé ou d'une étoile (...). (Les types 15.045 à 15.090) Il semble que la plus grande partie du papier ainsi marqué soit originaire du midi de la France, ou du Piémont. (...) Dans le groupe 15.103 à 15.112, la tête de bœuf porte au front un petit cercle, d'où s'élève le trait



Graphs available of all watermarks -> data does not refer directly to J.B.VII.6. High use in **1449** approx.







3 Piccard - Bernstein Briquet WZMA Bull's head Oxhead, free, with upper sign, with a single-Bull's head with eyes and nostrils, Tête de Boeuf, à yeux et à narines, contour rod, with a star (single contour), six above star consisting of one line, surmontée d'un trait ou d'une ètoile rayed (straight ends), without any further rod over circle in head indication, with eyes and nostrils, with circle on the forehead Luminaries, moon, detached, with additional Crescent Croissant, les pointes tournées en Luminary, crescent with cross, motif, cross consisting in one line, pommetty cross with circular extremities haut on en bas, croix pommée moon cross, one transverse fess







Bull's head [a] from B42




6a. Gr II, mR4

### Search in original material

### Archivio di Stato di Torino

*Genève 14° Cat* in ASTo - all watermarks from 1444 to 1460

- bull's head without circle from 1444 to 1460
- bull's head with circle in 1447-1448
- other watermarks + grape as in B42 (and cod. 69)

### National University Library in Torino

All paper manuscript from XV century:

- incomplete *bull's head*
- Grape as in B42

### Diocesan Library in Aosta

In Bornyon Library there are no matches at all in: watermarks, binding, dimensions and content.

NB. the cataloguing of books is, at this day, to be completed

- Manuscripts
  - Liturgical = completed
  - Non liturgical = not completed
- Incunabola: completed
- XVI century printed books: work in progress




# Paper structures


### **Dimensions**

- height x width -> J.B.VII.6. = **290x412 mm** Size
- Lenght + Height -> J.B.VII.6. = **702mm** Proportion
  - Height / Lenght -> J.B.VII.6. = **0,703**

Main chain-line interval - > J.B.VII.6. = **38mm** 

- Wide interval : 33-44 mm (J.B.VII.6. =38mm)
- Narrow interval: 22-33 mm

# Conclusions

### Watermarks

Co-presence of similar watermarks to J.B.VII.6. and watermarks from B42

- Cod 69 (WZMA) *bull's head* [a] with and without circle + grape B42
- Genève from ASTo direct match for J.B.VII.6. + grape B42

# Paper structures

- Size closer to Northen Italy
- Proportions closer to Northen Italy and France (expecially Turin and Paris)
- High percentage of Italian books are *in-folio*
- Wider chain-line intervals are more likely found in France (than Germany)

Many elements support the hypothesis that J.B.VII.6.'s paper was produced in Piedmont, in Caselle Torinese paper mill, regardless of direct matches in catalogues and databases.

It can be said, with very little doubt, that the production period falls between 1442 and 1451.
